Objectives and investment policy

Objective: The Fund aims to grow your investment.

Policy: The Fund invests at least 70% of its assets in shares of companies based in India, Pakistan, Sri Lanka or Bangladesh and that are listed on exchanges in these countries. Where companies are closely associated with India, Pakistan, Sri Lanka or Bangladesh they may be listed on exchanges worldwide.

The Fund may invest up to 100% of its assets in emerging markets of the Indian subcontinent, in companies of any size or industry. Emerging markets are countries that are progressing toward becoming advanced, usually shown by some development in financial markets, the existence of some form of stock exchange and a regulatory body.

The Fund's performance is compared against the value of the MSCI India Index.

The Fund is actively managed meaning that the Fund's manager uses expertise to pick investments rather than tracking a benchmark. A majority of the Fund's assets could be components of the benchmark. Investment of the Fund's assets is not constrained by the benchmark composition and the

- The synthetic risk reward indicator (the SRRI) rating is not a measure of the risk of you losing the entire value of your investment but describes how much the value of the share class has gone up and down in the past. Fund's manager has discretion within the Fund's investment policy to invest in assets without regard to the benchmark.

The Fund may use derivatives with the aim of risk reduction or efficient management.

You can buy and sell shares in the Fund on any dealing day. A dealing day is generally defined as a day on which Irish banks and, if applicable, the relevant stock exchange(s) are open for business. Exceptions are noted on the FSI website. As long as we receive your instruction before 10 am (Irish time) on a dealing day, shares will be bought and sold at that day's price.

You may receive a regular income from your investment which will be paid semi-annually. This may affect the potential growth of your investment.

Recommendation: This Fund may not be appropriate for investors who plan to withdraw their money within five years.

- The value of the Fund and its return is not guaranteed and may fall as well as rise. You may get back significantly less than you originally invested. Material risks not adequately captured by the SRRI:
- Currency risk: the Fund invests in assets which are denominated in other currencies; changes in exchange rates will affect the value of the Fund and could create losses. Currency control decisions made by governments could affect the value of the Fund's investments and could cause the Fund to defer or suspend redemptions of its shares.
- Single country / specific region risk: investing in a single country or specific region may be riskier than investing in a number of different countries or regions. Investing in a larger number of countries or regions helps spread risk.
