What is this product?

Type:

The Product is a sub-fund of a collective investment scheme set up in Luxembourg as a company with variable capital, a Société d'Investissement à Capital Variable [SICAV]

Term:

This Product is not subject to any fixed term.

Objectives:

The aim of the Product is to provide risk-adjusted returns through investments in hard currency denominated debt issued in emerging market countries. The Product invests in a portfolio primarily comprised of debt instruments (i.e. notes, bonds, certificates etc.) issued by public or private issuers in developing countries (emerging markets) and denominated in currencies of countries, which are members of the OECD (Organisation for Economic Cooperation and Development). The Investment Manager invests in countries where the Investment Manager is able to assess specific political and ESG risks. Issuers are located in emerging market countries in South and Central America (including the Caribbean), Central and Eastern Europe, Asia, Africa and the Middle East. Furthermore, the Product enters into emerging market currency forward contracts (a currency market transaction in which a seller agrees to deliver a specific currency to a buyer at some point in the future). The Product can also take long and short positions in markets, securities and groups of securities through derivative contracts and may invest up to 10% of its net assets in contingent convertible securities (CoCos). The Product may invest in debt securities of any maturity or credit rating and may invest in high yield debt securities. The Product may invest up to 10% of its net assets in distressed or defaulted debt securities. The Investment Manager seeks to integrate material environmental, social and governance (ESG) factors within its investment process.

The Product's performance is measured against the benchmark, the JPMorgan Emerging Markets Bond Index (EMBI) Global Diversified. The Product is actively managed within its objective and is not constrained by a benchmark.

This Product promotes environmental and/or social characteristics within the meaning of Article 8 of SFDR.

Any income generated by the Product is reinvested to grow the value of your investment.

You can buy and sell shares in the Product on a daily basis on any full working day in Luxembourg and when the New York Stock Exchange is open for trading. Further information on the Product's investment objectives and policy are detailed in the prospectus.

Intended Retail Investor:

The Product is not suitable for investors who plan to withdraw their money within 5 years. Investors should consider the Product only for the more aggressive portion of their portfolio. In addition, the Product is intended for investors who can accept the risks entailed in investing in securities of emerging market countries. The Product is suitable for investors who: Seek a return over the long term; Seek income whether in the form of capital appreciation or distributions, as outlined in the "Dividend Policy" section of the prospectus; Accept the risks associated with this type of investment, as set out in the "Risk Factors" section of the prospectus

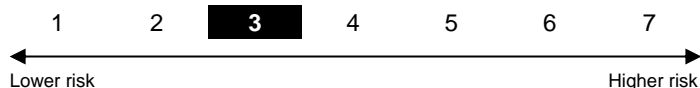

What are the risks and what could I get in return?

Risk indicator



The risk indicator assumes you keep the product for 5 Years. The actual risk can vary significantly if you cash in at an early stage and you may get back less. You may not be able to sell your product easily or you may have to sell at a price that significantly impacts on how much you get back.

The summary risk indicator is a guide to the level of risk of this product compared to other products. It shows how likely it is that the product will lose money because of movements in the markets or because we are not able to pay you.

We have classified this product as class 3 out of 7, which is a medium-low risk class. This rates the potential losses from future performance at a medium-low level, and poor market conditions are unlikely to impact the capacity of the fund to pay you.

Be aware of currency risk. You will receive payments in a different currency, so the final return you will get depend on the exchange rate between the two currencies. This risk is not considered in the indicator shown above.

In some circumstances you may be required to make further payments to pay for losses.

The Management Company, as the manufacturer of this product has no obligation to pay out since the product design does not contemplate any such payment being made. However, investors may suffer loss if the Fund or the depositary is unable to pay out. There is no compensation or guarantee scheme in place which may offset, all or any, of this loss.

Costs over Time

The tables show the amounts that are taken from your investment to cover different types of costs. These amounts depend on how much you invest, how long you hold the Product and how well the product does. We have assumed:

- In the first year you would get back the amount that you invested (0% annual return). For the other holding periods we have assumed the Product performs as shown in the moderate scenario.

How long should I hold it and can I take money out early?

Recommended holding period: 5 Years

This product is designed for long term investments; you should be prepared to stay invested for at least 5 years. However, you can redeem your investment without penalty incurred for disinvestment prior to the end of the recommended holding period, or hold the investment longer. Redemptions must be received by the registrar and transfer agent no later than 4pm GMT to be dealt with on the basis of the net asset value per share applicable on that valuation date. Redemptions received by the registrar and transfer agent after that cut-off time will be dealt with on the next valuation date. Redemptions may be made in a number of shares. Redemption payments will be affected three (3) Bank business days, which are also days when the relevant foreign exchange market is open, after the redemption of the shares. Any cashing-in before the end of the recommended holding period may have a negative consequence on your investment.
